ACTING ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF Mayor Jejomar C. Binay to the Municipal Council contained in his letter to the Majority Floor Leader, dated October 10, 1988, to rename Pasong Tamo Street to Chino Roces Ave, Street to honor and perpetuate the memory of Don Joaquin Roces, publisher of the Manila Times; and after the lively exchange of opinion on the proposed resolution and further considering the duly approved amendment introduced of councilor Feliciano P. Bascon, Jr. to include that portion of Pasonf Tamo street, fronting the Philippine Racing Club, so,

Upon motion of Councilor Feliciano P. Bascon, Jr. duly seconded, the following resolution was passed on second and third reading:

**RESOLUTION NO. 66**

WHEREAS, Joaquin P. Roces died on September 30, 1988;

WHEREAS, Don Chino as Joaquin P. Roces was popularly and fondly known, devoted his entire lifetime to the cause of freedom and democracy, firstly as publisher of Manila Times before Martial Law and later as a street parliamentarian in the struggle for the restoration of the democracy;

WHEREAS, Don Chino was the galvanizing force in the overthrow of the Marcos dictatorship by initializing the historic and successful gathering of the one million signature urging Corazon Aquino to run in the snap presidential elections in 1986;

WHEREAS, even in the dying days of his life, Don Chino's concern was for the Filipino people as when he voiced the need for a new moral order in the government as well as in the lives of the Filipino People;

WHEREAS, the people of Makati as the beneficiaries of the restoration of democracy, wish to perpetuate the memory of Don Chino Roces by naming a public Street in the municipality, in his honor;

WHEREAS, Pasong Tamo street is the site of various media establishments, like the Philippine Free Press, Balita and Radio & T.V stations and therefore a street that is vote fitting and proper to associate with the journalistic career of the late Don Chino Roces.

#### NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED , AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Sangguniang Bayan of Makati, Metro Manila, in session assembled to rename Pasong Tamo Street up to the Pasong Tamo Extension including that portion fronting the Philippine Racing Club, to Chino Roces Ave.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event that the renaming of Pasong Tamo Street needs approval of National Offices, to request the Honorable Mayor to make strong representations with proper governmental agencies for the approval of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to furnish copies of this resolution to the National Historical Commission for its approval and for its archives and permanent record.
